You are no doubt aware that a public consultation was recently held on the draft version of the emerging Basildon Local Plan. That consultation ended in January.

It now transpires that important details were missing from that consultation and there will be another one! The new consultation starts on Monday 24 February and can be found here:

Whilst it's good that residents are being given the opportunity to comment on such matters it is frustrating that this drip feed of information doesn't allow us to have a single complete view of the Local Plan and make good, well informed, comments.

But it's worse than that, there remains missing information on critical items such as the impact on our roads and the delivery of infrastructure and services to meet the proposed 27,000 new homes. There is a very good argument that Basildon Council needs to stop, take stock, and present residents with a complete plan for comment rather than continuing this confusing and piecemeal approach!

Worth warning residents to check any hedges in front of their house.

Hello,

Just received the latest edition of the Resident mag, just to clarify something. The cormorants are resident at Lake Meadows, I've counted 8 on the island trees over the winter. There are no fish left in the lake under 1-1 half pound in weight, they have all been eaten by these destructive birds. Only Carp remains in the lake. These birds have a direct effect on Herons and Kingfishers. Work it out, an adult Cormorant weighs around 2kg, it eats its body weight in fish a day, times 8 on a small lake like Lake Meadows, not many small fish will remain. I do agree though with the water fountains but not really needed in the colder months.

rom 28 April 2025, Basildon Borough Council's new waste service will commence with weekly residual waste collections returning and the current white and blue reusable sacks being replaced with two single-use disposable bags: white for cans and plastic, and blue for paper and cardboard. Distribution of bags will commence March 2025. If you live in a flat and have communal bins you will not be affected by this change and should continue to use the recycling bins provided.

The existing blue and white sacks will be collected from you before or soon after the change in service starts, and taken to a recycling facility.

eet Norman Turner, who was 100 on the 22nd February 2025. He moved to Trinity Road Billericay in 1960, where he immediately became involved with the BDRA and delivered the newsletter, which in those days was called The Mayflower.

He moved to his current address in Fairfield Rise in 1984, and soon became the road rep for Fairfield Rise, but stopped in 2020 when Covid arrived and he was still a young man of 95!

There were birthday celebrations at Norman's house on Saturday, when his two children, four grandchildren and five great grandchildren all celebrated this milestone, which included a card from the King and Queen.

Norman still lives alone, looking after himself with a small amount of help from carers and family. What a great achievement, what changes Norman must have lived through. What's his secret to living such a long life? He says lots of exercise: He retired from Essex County Council in 1990, where he was Footpath Officer, but he also walked and cycled for many years. Longevity obviously runs in the family, whilst chatting to Norman I met his brother, a young 90-yearold, who has driven from South Wales on his own to celebrate Norman's special birthday!

According to Wikipedia, Norman is one of only 2,730 male centenarians in England and Wales, of whom a very small proportion live on their own. We always knew he was special.

We all wish Norman well and many more healthy years to come.
