As a result, we have no new details to share with you this month but the threat of over 27,000 new houses over the next 20 years and the resulting loss of the Green Belt remains.

n the 2nd October 2004 the first parkrun took place at Bushy Hertfordshire, when 13 runners took part in a 5k run. Nationally, 336,627 people finished the 5k course and 45,867 volunteered. *That's awesome!*

Winter Fuel Payment advice and support!

Basildon borough is helping pensioners with their heating costs this Winter

1. Basildon Council's Warm Home Guarant

asildon Council has allocated £100,000 to give a one-time grant of up to £100 to eligible households. Grants will be disbursed on a first-come, first served basis until funds are exhausted and is only available to a household once per annum. The council is calling on the entire community to get involved and inform others about the scheme to make sure that no one is left out in the cold this winter.



Eligibility Criteria

Age: Applicant must be a pensioner (state pension age or above).

Income: Household income of between £219 and £300 if single or £332 and £450 if a pensioner couple and not eligible for pension credit.

Residency: Must be a resident within the borough and not have a second home.

2. UK Government's Pension Credit sche

ension Credit is available for people over state pension age and on a low income. It gives extra money to help with living costs but has a very low

take-up rate across the country, Basildon Council's Outreach and Engagement team will help people to claim what they are entitled to. The team can be contacted either by phone, through face-to-face appointments or at one of our outreach locations across the borough. The team are available to help people get the support they need whether that's from council services, via external providers or through extra discretionary financial help.

t our recent AGM, we shared some old photographs of Lake Meadows, a few taken even before the Moat became the park as we know it. We looked back to the early days in the 1930s, when the open-air swimming pool was built; whilst others showed the variety of very popular rowing boats introduced post WW2. There were photos to remind us of our childhood – the play area, the old rocking horse and the paddling pool; as well as the old Fort, which was a boathouse in Major Thomas Spitty's time.

The farmland, that was later to become the park, had belonged to the Major's family since 1831 and, occasionally during the following century, it was used for carnivals and pageants, often with local people in fancy dress adding to the delights. However, although Major Spitty organised the digging of the lake in the mid to late 1800s, it was not him, as some local people think, who gave the park to Billericay. Several people owned Hill House farm after Major Spitty & his wife died, and in fact it was a later owner, Mrs Cater (who set up the Cater Museum) who sold the land to the Billericay Rural District Council in 1935.

The park was officially opened on

July 11th 1936 by the chairman of the council Mr Matthew Land and soon became popular as a place to visit for local families, as well as those from Romford, Chelmsford and further afield. Visitors travelled by train, car and double-decker bus. In the early days Lake Avenue was the main entrance and the traffic caused chaos there was little parking available in the road and, on one occasion, the double decker buses brought the phone lines down!

Gradually, over the early years, improvements were made to the park. The Bowling Club settled there in 1948 and the boathouse was built the same year too. Tennis courts, a cricket square

and a soccer or hockey pitch were added, whilst a simple play area was provided close to the café that opened in 1950s, when the cricket and bowls pavilions were also built. The gardens flourished under the guidance of Reg King, one of the park keepers for many years, and his team. Following a storm in September 1958 that



caused considerable flooding, the lake was drained in the 1960s, the water level was reduced by a metre and the sluice bank strengthened.

Then, for the millennium, the beautiful statue of the Child in the Park was gifted to the children – sadly missing at the time of writing! In 2012 the Friends of Lake Meadows was formed and has since added many projects and improvements to our wonderful park.

Remus Horse Sanctuary made the King's Birthday Honours List!

hen Sue Burton set up the Remus Memorial Horse Sanctuary in 1983 few would have imagined that 41 years later it would be an established part of the local community, and that Sue's unstinting commitment would lead to her being awarded an OBE.

From its earliest days, Remus Memorial Horse Sanctuary, located near Ingatestone, Essex has grown into a safe haven for a range of animals from across Essex, Southern England and other parts of the UK. Borne from Burton's passion for animals and their welfare, the charity have been providing rescue, rehabilitation and care for horses, ponies, donkeys, sheep, goats and cats ever since! In 2023 the sanctuary celebrated its 40th anniversary.

Sue Burton was awarded the Medal of the Order of the British Empire for her services to equine welfare. His Majesty The King's Birthday Honours List 2024 selfless recognises and innovative service to others from people across the UK. Commenting on the award Sue stated she was "very proud and honoured to be selected...have always loved the work I do and have been honoured to care for so many wonderful creatures...none of that would be possible without the help and support of all our lovely members and supporters, staff and volunteers.'

Today, the Sanctuary provides rehabilitation and care for over 200 horses, ponies, donkeys, sheep, goats and cats. The Sanctuary likens their work to that of a hospice, giving animals, the very best of care, allowing them to heal from abuse and flourish

into happy adults. Fed, watered and cared for they also receive regular veterinary and farrier attention and benefit from holistic therapies. It takes a lot of hard work, money and effort to keep sick and elderly animals in such good condition, but this is after all is their stated mission.

The care provided by Sue and her team doesn't come cheap, though - costing in excess of £400,000 per year to run, Remus are always looking for ways to raise money to continue to provide this outstanding care. Not ones to rely solely on the donations of the public/businesses they also have a wonderful volunteer team who facilitate fundraising activities such as charity stalls, talks, quiz nights, fairs etc but they are still desperately in need of donations to help them keep caring for these beautiful animals.

As winter nears, the Sanctuary's plea for help grows increasingly urgent. As a community, we have the power to change the narrative for countless animals facing neglect and deprivation. By banding together, we can ensure that these vulnerable horses do not endure another winter alone and suffering. A Guide to Disposing of Leasehold or Freehold Property



Wardens (BTW) Chapel Street – "Garden of Peace"

t the request of the United Reformed Church (URC) in Chapel Street, the Town Council organized a "tidying-up" and a "litter pick" project of the Ancient Burial Ground between Chapel Street and Waitrose. To this end, our BTC Chairman Mark Thomas contacted the local charity and volunteer groups within the town with a request for help and a date was set for Saturday 3rd August.

The Tree Wardens was asked to comment on the environmental aspects of the project. We identified that several of the trees, for various reasons, would require the attention of a professional Tree Surgeon which should include some canopy thinning that would let more light down into the understorey below. Tree work would be arranged for a later date. It was highly likely that birds were nesting lower down in the shaded and tangled leafy corners so caution was required with pruning.

Back in early 2000, the Billericay Rotary Club (BRC), in partnership with the Town Council, had organized a major remedial project of the 18th century burial ground; involving a considerable amount of volunteer work and fund raising.

Since then, the gardens now presented a very different habitat as the pollarded trees had regrown their leafy canopies casting much shade below and the understory shrubs have grown unchecked. Sitting in the garden, in the heart of Billericay, one experiences the therapeutic feeling of peace and relaxation that visiting a cathedral inspires - A quiet and cloistered habitat for thoughtful contemplation.



A thank you to those volunteers who engaged with the project and to the adjacent "Billericay Brewery" that brought along a sample of their beers to slake the thirst of those grafting!

Volunteers came and went

throughout the "tidying-up" session and so there was no opportunity for the traditional group photograph!

There are very strict church rules that apply to working in Ancient Burial Grounds that were of course respected.


